GCSCC Successfully Completes Tax Credit Sales

Grafton County Senior Citizens Council, Inc. (GCSCC) announces that it has successfully sold all \$518,593 in 2015 and 2016 New Hampshire tax credits awarded to the agency in 2015 by the NH Community Development Finance Authority (CDFA).

All of the awarded tax credits needed to be sold by the end of March 2016. The Common Man Family of Restaurants and Meredith Village Savings Bank ensured project success by agreeing to purchase the agency's remaining tax credits earlier this month.

Seventeen businesses contributed to the successful tax credit sale. In addition to the Common Man Family of Restaurants and Meredith Village Savings Bank, the following businesses purchased GCSCC's awarded tax credits: Five M's Autogroup (Ford of Londonderry), Littleton Chevrolet/Littleton Auto Mart, Ledyard National Bank, Woodsville Guaranty Savings Bank, Geokon, Inc., Mascoma Savings Bank, New England Wire, White Mountain Footwear, Anthem Blue Cross & Blue Shield, Bank of New Hampshire, Lake Sunapee Bank, Community Guaranty Savings Bank, Union Bank, Huberts of West Lebanon, and Baker Newman & Noyes, LLC.

The funds will be used to address a wide variety of building upgrades at senior centers based in Plymouth, Canaan, Lebanon, Haverhill, and Littleton. Multiple approved projects were identified as building needs during a 2014 engineering assessment of the senior centers that GCSCC owns and operates.

A private nonprofit agency, GCSCC provides a growing population of older adults with community services including home delivered and senior center meals, transportation for older adults and adults with disabilities, outreach and counseling, chore assistance, and a wide range of other programs and activities, many focusing on health and wellness. In 2015, GCSCC served 8,500 individuals from across Grafton County and the surrounding area
